New Infrastructure Updates

As Fire & EMS Chief Kelly explains in this issue, new Fire & EMS Station 29 recently opened at the intersection of SR 131 and Sugar Camp Road. This is the fourth fire station in the Township and was necessary to serve the health and safety needs of a community that has grown to approximately 44,000 residents. Not only will Station 29 allow us to more quickly serve the emergency medical needs of residents in that fast-growing area of the Township, but it will improve the response times of other areas of the Township by enabling the paramedics and firefighters at the existing three stations to stay within their zones of service more frequently. We appreciate the support of the residents to make the new fire station possible.

Two new sidewalk projects were also recently completed by Miami Township. The first sidewalk installed this summer was to increase pedestrian safety on the main thoroughfare of Wolfpen Road. A new sidewalk connects the Milford Junior High and Senior High School campuses with neighborhoods and the Pinebrook senior living community. This was a continuation of the Wolfpen pedestrian and vehicular safety project that was finished earlier this decade on Wolfpen Road.

A second sidewalk on a main thoroughfare that was just completed was to install sidewalks on the east side of Buckwheat Road between SR 28 and Mulberry

Elementary, the under-construction Miami Twp. Branch of the Clermont County Library, Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton church and school, Community Park and Live Oaks campus. This sidewalk also was a second phase of an earlier one installed previously on Buckwheat south of this location.

In addition to the obvious reasons for installing sidewalks along Wolfpen and Buckwheat Roads due to the number schools and public uses they connect, it was also comparatively more cost effective and easier to construct since those locations did not require the additional expense of additional right-of-way, clearing of trees, or drainage ditch issues to overcome. They were funded with specific proceeds from new commercial developments that have occurred in those areas of SR 28.



Station 29 Now in Service

On June 28th, our crews officially moved into and started operating out of the new Fire Station 29 at 5644 Sugar Camp Road. This facility took approximately ten months to build, after a few years of conceptualization, discussion, land acquisition, and planning. The building is just under 10,000 square feet and houses one fire engine, and one advanced life support (ALS) paramedic unit. There is additional space in the apparatus bays to house our Mass Casualty Unit, which is a regional asset for southwest Ohio that was purchased with government grant funds. The station is staffed around the clock with a crew of three to five people, depending on daily staffing.

This station was designed with some state-of-the-art technology built into it, and adheres to many of the LEED design standards related to lighting and HVAC controls. The goal was to make this facility as environmentally friendly and cost-efficient as possible since the building operates on a continuous use cycle, unlike most standard office buildings. Additionally, we worked to make use of every space possible, so the mezzanine in our apparatus bays that houses the water heater, duct work and an air compressor also has a training area incorporated into it. The training area consists of two windows that our crews can practice accessing, an anchor wall to practice rope rescue evolutions with, and a manhole that descends into the room below the mezzanine to practice confined space rescue.

We would like to thank the community for their support of our expanded operations over the last few years, and for their involvement with bringing this new fire station to fruition. This new station was designed to last us for the next fifty years, so we plan to get our full use out of it!

We are honored to be able to present this state-of-the-art facility to our community and will be hosting an open house on Saturday, September 30th from 2 pm until 4 pm for anyone that would like to come and tour the new station. We will also have ice cream for everyone to enjoy, and some fun items for the kids to take home! Please come join us as we celebrate the first newly constructed Township-owned facility in almost 25 years.



Help First Responders Know Where You Are

Seconds seem like minutes, and minutes like hours, when you are waiting for first responders (Fire/EMS/Police) to respond to your call for service. When danger is already present or a medical emergency is occurring; the critical time is heightened if responders have trouble finding you.

Miami Township Police and Fire receive calls for service at both business and residential locations for a variety of calls each day. In 2016, Miami Township Police received more than 22,800 call for service and many times responding is slowed down by not locating the address of the caller sooner than later. Present day technology helps first responders, but nothing helps more than a clearly marked address on a mailbox, your home or the business.

At times, finding address numbers during the daylight hours is difficult. But, the nighttime hours become even more difficult with poorly marked address numbers. First responders must illuminate residences to attempt to locate the correct address for which the emergency is happening. The time searching may disrupt neighbors, distract drivers on the

roadways and ultimately delays our response.

The best way to help yourself and first responders is to make sure your address is clearly displayed and can be observed from each direction that first responders may approach. One suggestion is to install a green 911 safety sign, printed on both sides with your address numbers, for plain view. We recommend you keep landscaping below your displayed address to prevent obstruction of your address numbers being clearly seen. Displaying your address numbers as close to the roadway as possible and near the entry drive, is also very helpful.

Back to School Bus Safety for Students & Motorists

25 million students nationwide begin and end their day with a trip on a school bus. Designed for safety, with flashing lights, giant mirrors, high seat backs and that bright yellow color, school buses keep more than 17 million cars away from school buildings every day. (National Safety Council, 2017)

Students are about 70 times more likely to get to school safely when taking a bus instead of traveling by car. That's because school buses are the most regulated vehicles on the road; they are designed

to be safer than passenger vehicles in preventing crashes and injuries, and in every state, stop-arm laws protect children from other motorists. (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, 2017)

While riding a bus to school is safer than riding in the family vehicle or walking, bus stop safety is important because the greatest risk to your child is not riding a bus, but approaching or leaving one. Before your child goes back to school or starts school for the first time, it's important for you and your child to know traffic safety rules. Teach your child to follow these practices to make school bus transportation safer.


FOR PARENTS:

- Your child should arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive. Visit the bus stop and show your child where to wait for the bus: at least three giant steps (six feet) away from the curb. Remind your child that the bus stop is not a place to run or play.

- When the school bus arrives, your child should wait until the bus comes to a complete stop, the door opens, and the driver says it is okay before approaching the bus door. Your child should use the handrails to avoid falling.

- Your child should never walk behind a school bus. If your child must cross the street in front of the bus, tell

him/her to walk on a sidewalk or along the side of the street to a place at least five giant steps (10 feet) in front of the bus before crossing. Your child should also make eye contact with the bus driver before crossing to make sure the driver can see him/her. If your child drops something near the school bus, like a ball or book, the safest thing is for your child to tell the bus driver right away. Your child should not try to pick up the item, because the driver might not be able to see him/her.



FOR DRIVERS:

Make school bus transportation safer for everyone by following these practices:

- When backing out of a driveway or leaving a garage, watch out for children walking or bicycling to school.

- When driving in neighborhoods with school zones, watch out for children who may be thinking about getting to school, but may not be thinking of getting there safely.

- Slow down. Watch for children walking in the street, especially if there are no sidewalks in neighborhood.

- Watch for children playing and congregating near bus stops.

- Be alert. Children arriving late for the bus may dart into the street without looking for traffic.

- Learn and obey these school bus laws for the State of Ohio, as well as the “flashing signal light system” that school bus drivers use to alert motorists of pending actions:

- Pleasant Hill Road or Buckwheat Road for example), drivers traveling in both directions must stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the school bus picking up or dropping off passengers.

Drivers must remain stopped until the bus resumes motion, or until the school bus driver signals traffic can proceed.

- On a road with four or more through lanes (SR 28 for example), drivers approaching a stopped bus from the opposite direction do not need to stop while passengers are entering and exiting the bus. This exception may not be applicable in other states other than Ohio. The reason Ohio has this exemption is that Ohio law requires drivers operating a school bus on a road with four or more lanes to drop off or pick up passengers on the side of the road the passenger lives.

- Similar to a two-lane road, drivers traveling in the same direction as the bus, either behind it or beside it, are required to stop on a road with four or more lanes.

- Violations can result in fines up to \$500 and a suspended driver license for up to a year.

- **Yellow flashing lights** indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.

- **Red flashing lights and extended stop arms** indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop-arm is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.

Senior Housing and Care Options

Miami Township has many interesting options when it comes to senior living and care within the community. A concern heard in some areas is that there is no place to stay within the community while you age. That is not the case for Miami Township. The continuum of senior living and care facilities can fall within the following types, many of which we see in Miami Township:

NON AGE RESTRICTED – such as ranch style apartments that may appeal to older adults but are open to all ages

AGE RESTRICTED – must be of a certain age to live at the facility

INDEPENDENT – has amenities geared toward seniors such a food service, cleaning, shared spaces, social opportunities; can still live independently but minimal assistance is available if necessary

ASSISTED – has additional care options for those that need help with daily activities, such as medical, bathing, transportation, finances; typically apartment living


SKILLED NURSING – more temporarily oriented, such as for rehabilitation after hospitalization or after significant decline in health

NURSING HOME – need higher level and more constant care that in assisted living, have more severe cognitive or physical limitations, usually in a room rather than apartment

MEMORY CARE – special living arrangements and facilities for those with memory impairment, may be associated with assisted living.

UPDATE: 2017 Service Department Projects



John Musselman

Thank you to residents for their patience this year as many improvements were made, and continue to be made, to improve infrastructure and safety, enhance our parks and better our great community. Here is a snapshot of some the projects your Service Department has been working on:

- Nearing completion of erosion protection wall around Miami Meadows Lake. This will prevent further lake-bank erosion, minimize further siltation of the lake bottom, provide improved access for people fishing the lake, and it improves the overall appearance of the facility.
- Our 2017 Paving Program resurfaced 5.6 miles of Township roads.
- We completed the Wolfpen Pleasant Hill sidewalk project-connecting the school and church to nearby side-streets and creating a safer walking environment for nearby residents.
- Nearing completion of the Buckwheat sidewalk project-connecting schools and creating a safer walking environment.
- Nearing completion of switch-over of two Township buildings to natural gas from heating oil and propane. This project will pay for itself over the next few years and will save money long after we have recouped our investment in the upgrade.
- Contracted with a company to perform ground penetrating radar in Evergreen Cemetery so we can expand operations into areas of the Cemetery previously un-surveyed. This ensures burial space for the next 15 to 20 years which will help fund that facilities operation.
- We were recently awarded emergency grant funds from the Ohio Public Works Commission to repair a slope which claimed a portion of the roadway on Dry Run Road. Our goal is to have this road repaired and re-opened to two lanes of traffic later this fall.
- We recently installed a decorative and functional fountain in the pond at Miami Meadows Spirit of 76 Park



- in through a generous donation made by Milford Exempted Village School District Elementary and Preschools students.
- We are embarking on a sidewalk project that will replace the existing chip path at the Miami Meadows Spirit of 76 Park. This will greatly improve the walk-ability of the Memorial Gardens that surround the pond. Our goal is to complete this sidewalk this fall.
- Another fall project is the installation of decorative lighting along Romar Drive, similar to those already in place along Business 28.
