- **SECTION 2:** The Board does hereby dispense with the requirement that this Resolution be read on two separate days, pursuant to Section 504.10 of the Ohio Revised Code, and authorizes the adoption of this Resolution upon its first reading.
- **SECTION 3** That this Board hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of its Committees, if any, which resulted in formal

action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3: This Resolution shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION 4: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety and well-being of the residents of the Township and in order to ensure the funds certified by the Fiscal Officer are approved by the Board of Trustees in a timely manner as required by Ohio law.
