VINE is a free service that allows you to anonymously check on an offender's custody status by phone, website, or mobile app. You can also register to receive automated notifications about changes in custody status by phone, email, text or mobile app. TTY (hearing impaired) service is also available.

VINE Service Provider Directory

Connect with local, regional and national victim service providers through the VINE Service Provider Directory. The directory is a comprehensive listing of support services, such as victim assistance, crisis support, basic needs, healthcare, counseling, legal assistance, financial assistance, and children's services. Access the directory by visiting VINELink.com or using the VINELink mobile app. Click on SEARCH and select Service Provider to begin.

VINE Facts

- If you feel you are in danger, call 911 immediately.
- VINE is confidential. The offender will not know you are registered with this service.
- VINE only provides information on offenders in custody.
- Since VINE calls automatically when an offender's custody status changes, you may get a call from VINE in the middle of the night.
- Write down your PIN and keep it in a safe place.
 For safety reasons, do not share this information with others.
- If you do not answer a notification call, VINE will leave a message and will continue calling back until you enter your PIN or until up to 24 hours have passed.
- Do not register a phone number that rings to a switchboard.
- You can register multiple phone numbers and email addresses for notifications.
- If you forget your PIN, call the toll-free number and press zero. You will be transferred to an operator who can help you reset your PIN or cancel notification.
- Operators are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to assist you.

Ohio VINE

Information

VINE is a service that lets victims of crime and other concerned citizens access timely and reliable information regarding offenders. It is offered free of charge to registrants, is completely confidential, and features multiple language support.

Registration

If the offender is in custody, you can register to be notified about the following events:

· Offender custody status

To access offender custody information and register to be notified:

- Download the VINELink mobile app
- TTY users, call 1-866-847-1298

Notification

The VINE service allows you to select your preferred notification method:

- Phone
- Text
- Mobile App
- Email
- TTY

You must register separately for each type of notification.

Phone Notifications

If registering a phone number, you will be asked to create a four-digit personal identification number (PIN) that will be used to confirm that the call was received. Make sure your PIN is easy to remember.



When VINE calls, listen to the message, and enter your PIN followed by the # key. Entering your PIN lets VINE know that you received the call and will stop the service from calling you again until there is another change in custody status.

Notification Events

Once you are registered, VINE will notify you of offender status changes, such as:

- Release
- Transfer
- Escape
- Death
- Other
